In a wider sense, this name appears to have comprehended the gigantic nations of Canaan (see עֲנָקִים, וְעֲנָקִים, אֲנָשִׁים), Deut. 2:11, 20.</p> <p>רָפָה ("casting down," "throwing down," i.e. a hero, a champion, a giant) [Raphah], pr. n.—(1) of an ancient giant, whose descendants, who were also giants, were called יְלִירֵי הָרָפָה and רָפָאִים; see that word.—(2) 1 Ch. 8:37; for which there is 1 Ch. 9:43, רָפָה [Rephaiah], ("whom Jehovah healed")</p> |

רָפָא—(1) i. q. רָפָה *flaccid, feeble, weak*, only in pl. רָפָאִים, i. e. *manes*, shades living in Hades, according to the opinions of the ancient Hebrews, void of blood and animal life (רָפָה), therefore weak and languid like a sick person (Isa. 14:10), but not devoid of powers of mind, such as memory (Isa. 14:9, seqq.), Ps. 88:11; Pro. 2:18; 9:18; 21:16; Isaiah 26:14, 19.

(2) [*Rapha*], pr. n. borne by—(a) the ancestor of the Canaanitish nation of the Rephaim (רָפָאִים, which see), 1 Chr. 20:4, seq. Compare also רָפָה.—(b) 1 Ch. 8:2.—(c) 1 Ch. 4:12. [בִּית־רָפָא.]
